Rest Haven Cemetery




Rest Haven Garden Association was formed on May 5, 1953. The original organizers of the cemetery were: John P. Storrs, Marcia A. Storrs, Alve M. Newton, George D. Newton, Douglas J. Curtis, Gwen S. Curtis, and Hazel A. Alf. Douglas J. Curtis served as the first Chairman and Marcia Storrs was the Secretary.

The Town of Washington acquired Rest Haven Gardens Cemetery on September 2, 1999, as a Town Cemetery.

Rest Haven Cemetery

Rest Haven Cemetery is made up of four gardens with a statue in each: Devotion (open Bible), Last Supper (imitated picture of Leonardo da Vinci's Last Supper), Christus (Christ), and Memory (future statue planned). Each garden has approximately 200 separate blocks with 16 spaces per block. Numbered metal hubs in the ground are used to mark the grave space numbers.

A separate area for infant burials called the Garden of Angels is also available. This garden is located near the entrance of the cemetery on the left.

We do not have a columbarium for cremations.

Staff

A full-time sexton and a part-time seasonal employee maintain the cemetery grounds. All questions should be directed to the Town office.

Deeds & Transfers

All deeds and deed transfers are completed through our Town office. Call to schedule an appointment. Payment in full is required before a deed can be issued.

Burials

All burials are scheduled through the Town office. Not more than one body shall be interred in one grave space. The Town does allow the burial of two cremations in a single space if the headstone contains the necessary information for both burials.

Headstones

All markers are flat headstones and placed by the cemetery staff. Headstones are required within one year of a burial.

Decorations

No decorations can be placed or planted directly on the ground. Shepherd's hook are not allowed. Items that are in violation of our rules & regulations will be removed. Pedestal type plant stands permitted (only allowed after a burial and one per space). The pedestal shall not exceed 2 inches in diameter and shall be painted black or green. The distance from the bottom of the urn holder to the top of the marker shall be 24 inches and the urn shall be round and not less than 10 inches or more than 14 inches in diameter. Vases that affix directly to the marker that can either be removed or recessed in the marker are permitted. They must be removed or recessed each year on or before October 15.

New flags are placed on veteran's graves each year before Memorial Day.

Approved items are allowed from: May 1 - October 15 and again from November 1 - April 1

Items left after deadlines will be removed.
